

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MINUTES
February 16, 2010**

A meeting of the Pennington County Board of Commissioners was held on Tuesday, February 16, 2010, in the Commissioners' meeting room of the Pennington County Courthouse. Chairperson Ethan Schmidt called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Gale Holbrook, Jim Kjerstad and Nancy Trautman. Commissioner Brenda Young was absent.

REVIEW AND APPROVE AGENDA

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

After consideration, it was MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to reconsider the agenda. Vote: Unanimous. MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to amend the agenda to add Item 9C, Equitable Sharing Agreement, under Items From Sheriff. Vote: Unanimous.

REVIEW MINUTES: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to approve the minutes of the February 2, 2010, Board of Commissioners' meeting. Vote: Unanimous.

LIEN RELEASE REQUEST (DJ): MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to accept the supporting documentation provided and place a note on the \$150.00 lien recorded in the name of Dennis Jensen that the Dennis C. Jensen living in New Underwood is not responsible for the debt. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM THE AUDITOR

A. **NEW RETAIL (ON-OFF SALE) MALT BEVERAGE AND NEW RETAIL (ON-OFF SALE) WINE LICENSE:** MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Kjerstad to approve the retail (on-off sale) malt beverage license application and retail (on-off sale) wine license application for The Longhorn, The Lost Steer LLC. Vote: Unanimous.

B. **GENERAL FUND SUPPLEMENT(S) HEARING – SP10-001:** MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to supplement the 2010 General Fund Treasurer (\$10,000), John T. Vucurevich (JTV) Grant (\$20,524.31), Weed and Pest (\$30,545), and Planning Department (\$18,665) budgets for a total of \$79,734.31 from cash reserves created by unspent 2009 budgets. Vote: Unanimous.

C. **BOND RESOLUTION DESIGNATING RECOVERY ZONE:** MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Kjerstad to continue this item to the County Board meeting on April 20, 2010. MOVED by Holbrook to call the question. Vote: Schmidt – no, Kjerstad, Holbrook and Trautman - aye. The motion to call the question failed as it needed four votes to pass. Vote on the original motion: Unanimous.

PETITION FOR THE ANNEXATION THE HARNEY MOUNTAIN #2 ROAD DISTRICT: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to accept the Resolution for Annexation to the Harney Mountain #2 Road District of the following legal description, effective for the 2010 tax year and forward: Balance of Section 33, Less GL 12, Less MS# 419-421, 524, 527-531, 585, 666, 668-669, 705-707, 804 & 980-981 of T1S, R5E, BHM, Pennington County. Vote: Unanimous.

E. USE OF COMMISSION SPACE: MOVED by Trautman and seconded Kjerstad to authorize the Auditor to use of the Board of Commissioners' North Conference Room for the Department of Legislative Audit while they are on-site for Pennington County's audit. Vote: Unanimous.

C. LAYOUT PLAT / PL 10-07 AND SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS VARIANCE / SV 10-02: Richard & Jody McKee; Fisk Land Surveying – Agent. To create Lots 1 and 2 of Tract 2 of McKee Subdivision and to waive platting requirements in accordance with Sections 400.1 and 700.1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: Tract 2, McKee Subdivision, Section 23, T1S, R3E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lots 1 and 2 of Tract 2, McKee Subdivision, Section 23, T1S, R3E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to approve Subdivision Regulations Variance 10-02 (1) to waive the requirement for the scale of the plat to be no greater than 1 inch equals 100 feet; (2) to waive the requirement to improve the Section Lines bordering the property to the north, south and east sides; (3) to waive the requirement for the proposed lots to be served by dedicated public right-of-way; and, (4) to waive the requirement for the access easement to be improved to a 24-foot-wide driving surface and require that it be improved to an 18-foot-wide driving surface and to approve Layout Plat 10-07 with the following eight (8) conditions:

1. That prior to County Board approval of the Final Plat, a 66-foot easement be constructed to a minimum of Local Road Standards or a Subdivision Regulations Variance be obtained waiving this requirement;
2. That at the time of Preliminary Plat submittal, the applicant submits percolation tests and soil profile information for proposed Lots 1 and 2 to be reviewed and approved by the Environmental Planner or obtain approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement;
3. That at the time of submittal of the Preliminary Plat, the applicant submits topography or obtains approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement;
4. That a turnaround be constructed in accordance with Table 1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations or the applicant obtains approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement;
5. That the applicant submits engineered road construction plans for the access road to be improved to Local Road standards or obtains approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement;
6. That the plat identifies the width of Medicine Mountain Road right-of-way on the plat;
7. That the Section Line Highway be improved to Ordinance 14 Standards or the applicant obtains approval of Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement; and,
8. That approval of this Layout Plat does not constitute approval of any further applications to be submitted for the above-described property. Vote: Unanimous.

D. FIRST READING AND PUBLIC HEARING OF REZONE / RZ 09-08 AND COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT / CA 09-06: James Hynes/Aubrey Pope; Frances Aubrey – Agent. To rezone 1.13 acres from General Agriculture District to Highway Service
