

**PENNINGTON COUNTY  
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MINUTES  
July 20, 2010**

A meeting of the Pennington County Board of Commissioners was held on Tuesday, July 20, 2010, in the Commissioners' meeting room of the Pennington County Courthouse. Chairperson Ethan Schmidt called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: De Glassgow, Gale Holbrook, Nancy Trautman and Brenda Young.

**REVIEW AND APPROVE AGENDA:** MOVED by Glassgow and seconded by Young to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

**REVIEW MINUTES:** MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Young to approve the minutes of the July 6, 2010, Board of Commissioners' meeting. Vote: Unanimous.

**ITEMS FROM AUDITOR**

A. **SPECIAL MALT BEVERAGE LICENSE – BLACK HILLS GERMAN GOODTIME CLUB:** MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to approve the Special Malt Beverage Application and License for the Black Hills German Goodtime Club for the German Fall Fest to be held September 3, 4, 10 and 11 at Palmer Gulch Campground. Vote: Unanimous.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, that the Pennington County Commission acknowledge and declare the Whaley Lane Road District to be organized and established as a governmental subdivision of the State of South Dakota and a public body, corporate and political to be effective as of today's date with taxing authority for the 2010 pay 2011 tax year and after.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the Whaley Lane Road District be described as follows: Lots 1-12 inclusive of Whaley Subdivision, BHM, Pennington County, SD

**2011 PROVISIONAL BUDGET APPROVAL**

MOVED by Glasgow and seconded by Young to approve the 2011 Provisional Budget totaling \$70,879,765. Vote: Unanimous.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION PER SDCL 1-25-2(4)**

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to convene in Executive Session at 9:25 a.m. Vote: Unanimous. Todd Meierhenry was invited to join the Board of Commissioners in Executive Session. The Board of Commissioners, with the exception of Commissioner Holbrook, returned at 9:35 a.m. MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to adjourn from Executive Session. Vote: Unanimous. Holbrook returned at 9:37 a.m.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to hire Todd Meierhenry of Meierhenry Sargent LLP as Pennington County's Local Counsel for bond issues. Vote: Unanimous.

**MASTER PLANNING COMMITTEE**

A. PROJECT FUNDING AND RECOMMENDATIONS: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to authorize the Master Planning Committee to work with Local Counsel, the Underwriter and Bond Counsel to develop a potential funding/project package based on the recommendations outlined in the Facilities Master Plan previously adopted by the Board of Commissioners. MOVED by Holbrook to call the question. The vote on calling the question carried 4-1 with Schmidt voting no. Vote: Unanimous.

B. POTENTIAL BONDING PACKAGES:

C. POTENTIAL RFP'S FOR DESIGN CONSULTANT SERVICES: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Glassgow to authorize the Master Planning Committee to issue a Request For Proposal (RFP) for design consultant services for the recommended projects. Vote: Unanimous.

**ITEMS FROM CENTRAL STATES FAIR – RON JEFFRIES**

A. GRANDSTAND UPGRADES: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to authorize the Pennington County Auditor, on behalf of the Central States Fair, to advertise for bids to purchase grandstand materials. It was noted that the bids will be advertised by Pennington County and opened and acted on by the Board of Commissioners. MOVED by Holbrook to call the question. The motion to call the question passed 4-1 with Schmidt voting no. Vote: Unanimous.

**ITEMS FROM EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

A. POINT OF DISPENSE (POD) GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to approve the Chairman's signature on the State of South Dakota Grant Agreement for POD development. Vote: Unanimous.

Trautman left the meeting.

B. 2010 STATE AND LOCAL AGREEMENT ADDENDUM: MOVED by Young and seconded by Glassgow to approve the 2010 Emergency Management State and Local Agreement Addendum and authorize the Chairman's signature. Vote: Unanimous.

Trautman returned to the meeting.

**ITEMS FROM EQUALIZATION**

A. ABATEMENT APPLICATIONS: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to approve the following abatements/refunds: Parcel ID 53956 - BE Development LLC, 2004 taxes totaling 275.58, 2005 taxes totaling 963.80, 2006 taxes totaling 930.82, 2007 taxes totaling 890.98, 2008 taxes totaling 1485.66, 2009 taxes totaling 1525.36; Parcel ID 34855 – Lowell Trust Agreement/Lutheran Social Services, 2008 taxes totaling 402.78, 2009 taxes totaling 496.24. Vote: Unanimous.

**ITEMS FROM HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT**

A. ROAD AND BRIDGE RESERVES AND UNORGANIZED ROAD RESERVES: MOVED by Glassgow and seconded by Young to designate \$4,000,000 in Road and Bridge Reserves and \$1,750,000 in Unorganized Road Reserves for future projects as listed on the 2011-2015 Transportation Improvement Plan for Pennington County. Vote: Unanimous.

B. AUTHORIZATION TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS – EQUIPMENT PURCHASE: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Young to authorize the Pennington County Highway Department to advertise for bids for six new motor graders and one new loader. Vote: Unanimous.

C. AUTHORIZATION TO BID – SURPLUS EQUIPMENT: MOVED by Young and seconded by Trautman to authorize the highway superintendent to place bids on the IronPlanet internet auction to be held on July 29, 2010, for a 1997 Ford CF7000 with a Rosco RA-300 Pothole Patcher and a 2006 Sterling SC8000 with a Tiger Pothole Patcher, with bids not to exceed 80 percent of the quote received from Titan Machinery of Rapid City, SD, and further moved to authorize payment by wire transfer to IronPlanet if Pennington County is the successful bidder. Vote: Unanimous.

The Board recessed at 11:10 a.m. and reconvened at 11:20 a.m.

A. REQUEST TO AMEND JULY 6, 2010, MOTION: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to rescind the motion made during the July 6, 2010, Commission meeting that directed the Human Resources (HR) Manager to develop a form to consistently document vacation and sick leave for exempt County employees. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Young and seconded by Trautman that County department heads that have a consistent, viable method of tracking sick, vacation and holiday hours for exempt employees should confirm that method with the HR Manager, and if no other method for tracking exempt employees is being used, departments should utilize the simple form developed by the HR Manager for that purpose. Vote: Unanimous.

B. PENNINGTON COUNTY EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK POLICY 722 - TAX CERTIFICATE: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Glasgow to remove Policy #722 titled “Tax Sale Certificate” from the Pennington County Employee Handbook pursuant to the recommendation of Human Resources Manager Nick Stroot and Chief Deputy States’ Attorney Jay Alderman. Vote: Unanimous.

REQUEST FOR STREET CLOSURE – Donna Crawford: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman continue this item to the August 3, 2010, Board of Commissioners’ meeting. Vote: Unanimous.

### **MISCELLANEOUS**

A. APPROVE VOUCHERS: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to approve the vouchers listed at the end of the minutes for expenditures for insurance, professional services, publications, rentals, supplies, repairs, maintenance, travel, conference fees, utilities, furniture and equipment, and authorize the chair’s signature thereto. Vote: Unanimous.

REQUEST FOR REFUND OF ADMINISTRATIVE FEES – EUGENE PLUTH: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to deny Eugene Pluth’s request to refund building permit fees in the amount of \$51.00, pursuant to Planning staff recommendation. Vote: The motion carried 4-1 with Glasgow voting no.

**ITEMS FROM PLANNING & ZONING**

MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Young to convene as a Board of Adjustment. Vote: Unanimous.

A. VARIANCE / VA 10-14: Kay Martin. To reduce the minimum required front yard setback from 25 feet to 3 feet along Nugget Street and to also reduce the minimum required front yard setback from 25 feet to 7 feet along Edelweiss Mountain Road in a Suburban Residential District in accordance with Sections 208 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lots 15 and 16, Block 8, Silver City, Section 31, T2N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to approve Variance / VA 10-14 with three conditions pursuant to Planning staff's recommendation. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That this Variance only applies for the portion of the setback requirements that are encroached upon by the existing residence and will be encroached upon by construction of the proposed addition. All other structures must maintain the proper setback requirements or obtain separate Variance(s) for that structure; 2. That at the time a Building Permit is applied for, the existing wastewater system (tank and drainfield) for the cabin shall be located to ensure it will meet all required setbacks from the proposed cabin addition. If it is determined that the wastewater system does not meet the minimum setback requirements from the cabin addition, a Variance shall be obtained from DENR prior to the issuance of the Building Permit; and, 3. That a Building Permit be obtained for any structure exceeding 144 square feet or located on a permanent foundation, which requires a site plan to be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director.

MOVED by Young and seconded by Trautman to adjourn as a Board of Adjustment and reconvene as a Board of Commissioners. Vote: Unanimous.

B. MINOR PLAT / PL 10-23: A. Alan and Sally Kelts; Fisk Land Surveying – Agent. To reconfigure lot lines to create Lot 1 – Revised, Block 3 of Plat No. 2 of Pine Cliff Subdivision in accordance with Section 400.3 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: Lot 1 of Block 3 of Pine Cliff Subdivision and a portion of Green Tract A of Lot A of Plat No. 2 of Pine Cliff Subdivision, Section 31, T2N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lot 1 – Revised, Block 3 of Plat No. 2 of Pine Cliff Subdivision, Section 31, T2N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to approve Minor Plat 10-23 with no conditions pursuant to Planning Commission recommendation. Vote: Unanimous.

C. LAYOUT PLAT / PL 10-24: Rochford Community Center; Robert A. Haivala – Agent. To combine two lots to create Lot 4A, Block 2, Dakota Lode M.S. 2109 in accordance with Sections 400.1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: Lot 4, Block 2 of Rochford Subdivision of Dakota Lode M.S 2109 and part of Lot 1 (26' by 60' in NE Corner) of Rochford Subdivision of Dakota Lode M.S. 2109, Section 23, T2N, R3E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lot 4A, Block 2, Dakota Lode M.S. 2109, Section 23, T2N, R3E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Trautman to approve Layout Plat 10-24 with the following ten (10) conditions pursuant to Planning Commission recommendation. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That prior to County Board approval of the Minor Plat, the applicant provide engineered road construction plans for any road improvements to be made or else a Subdivision Regulations Variance be obtained waiving this requirement;
2. That prior to County Board approval of the Minor Plat, North Rochford Road be improved to Local/Collector Road Standards for a Suburban Residential District, including a 66-foot-wide right-of-way with 24 feet of paved driving surface or else a Subdivision Regulations Variance be obtained waiving this requirement;
3. That prior to County Board approval of the Minor Plat, the 16 foot alleyway be improved to Local/Collector Road Standards for a Suburban Residential District, including a 66-foot-wide right-of-way with a 24-foot-wide paved driving surface or else a Subdivision Regulations Variance be obtained waiving this requirement;
4. That prior to County Board approval of the Minor Plat, a Lot Size Variance be obtained to reduce the minimum lot size requirement in a Suburban Residential District;
5. That at the time of Minor Plat submittal, the applicant shall provide documentation from Black Hills Electric verifying that they agree with the partial dedication of the utility easement along North Rochford Road or with the dedication of the utility easement along the interior sides of all side and rear lot lines;
6. That an updated as-built site plan be provided at the time of Minor Plat submittal showing the location of the existing structures and wastewater system in relation to the proposed lot lines and, if applicable, a Variance be obtained from DENR for any alterations to the existing on-site wastewater system, if it is determined to not be meeting the minimum separation distance to any nearby wells;
7. That the Minor Plat be drawn in accordance with the requirements of Section 400.3 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations, including all certifications with the exception of Section 400.3–n-10. Certificate of Planning Director;
8. That prior to submittal of the Minor Plat, the applicant shall work with NJS to coordinate the actual right-of-way line for North Rochford Road and either grant a permanent easement to Pennington County or dedicate additional right-of-way on the plat for the future road improvements to North Rochford Road;
9. That prior to County Board approval of the Minor Plat, the applicant shall abandon the existing outhouse by pumping the pit and filling it with soil; and,
10. That approval of this Layout Plat does not constitute approval of any further applications to be submitted for the above-described property.

**D. FIRST READING AND PUBLIC HEARING OF REZONE / RZ 10-01:** Yasmeen Dream. To rezone 27.58 acres from General Agriculture District to General Commercial District in accordance with Section 508 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

**COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT / CA 10-01:** Yasmeen Dream. To amend the Comprehensive Plan to change the Future Land Use from Low Density Residential District to General Commercial District in accordance with Section 508 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.
