

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MINUTES
August 17, 2010**

A meeting of the Pennington County Board of Commissioners was held on Tuesday, August 17, 2010, in the Commissioners' meeting room of the Pennington County Courthouse. Chairman Ethan Schmidt called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: De Glassgow, Gale Holbrook, Nancy Trautman and Brenda Young.

REVIEW AND APPROVE AGENDA

MOVED by Young and seconded by Trautman to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

REVIEW MINUTES

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to approve the minutes of the August 3, 2010, Board of Commissioners' meeting. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM AUDITOR

A. TOWNSHIP BONDS: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to set the bond for any organized civil township located in Pennington County at the minimum amount received by that township in the last calendar year and set the township clerk bond amount at \$5,000. It was further moved to authorize the Auditor to hold monies due to a township until annual reports and clerk and treasurer bond information is received by April first of each year. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM TREASURER

A. REQUEST FOR TRANSFER OF PROPERTY – CITY OF BOX ELDER: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to transfer the ownership of the property identified as Parcel ID 43426, located at 615 Sunnydale Road Box Elder, (Lot 4A of Block 8 of Sunnydale Estates Subdivision in Section 29, T2N, R9E, BHM, City of Box Elder, Pennington County, SD) to the City of Box Elder. Vote: Unanimous.

A. ABATEMENT APPLICATIONS: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Young to approve the 2009 abatement/refund requests for Katherine D. Watson/City of Keystone as follows: Parcel ID 3841, \$77.84; Parcel ID 58567, \$59.18. Vote: Unanimous.

MOUNTAIN PINE BEETLE PRESENTATION – BOB THOMPSON

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Glassgow to draft a letter from the Pennington County Board of Commissioners for Commissioner Glassgow to present to the Deputy Undersecretary of the USDA supporting aggressive measures to combat the mountain pine beetle epidemic in the

Black Hills National Forest, and further moved to authorize the Chairman's signature thereto. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

A. 2010 HOMELAND SECURITY CONDITIONAL GRANT AWARD #2: MOVED by Glasgow and seconded by Holbrook to approve Homeland Security Conditional Grant Award #2 for the 2011 Homeland Security Conference in the amount of \$150,000 and authorize the Chairman's signature thereto. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM HIGHWAY

A. SURPLUS EQUIPMENT: MOVED by Glasgow and seconded by Young to authorize the highway superintendent to place bids on the IronPlanet internet auction to be held on August 19, 2010, for a 2006 Sterling SC8000 with a Tiger Pothole Patcher, not to exceed \$58,000, and further moved to authorize a wire transfer for the amount bid to IronPlanet if Pennington County is the successful bidder. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM HUMAN RESOURCES

A. PROPOSED PENNINGTON COUNTY COMMISSION TRAVEL POLICY – Commissioner Holbrook: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Glasgow to approve the proposed Commission Office Travel Policy as follows: It is the policy of the Office of the County Commissioners that any travel outside of Pennington County by any County Commissioner must first be authorized by a majority vote of the County Commissioners. Vote: Unanimous.

NATIONAL FOREST COUNTIES AND SCHOOL COALITION

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young that Pennington County join the National Forest Counties and School Coalition with 2010 membership dues in the amount of \$578.63. Vote: Unanimous.

2011 PROVISIONAL BUDGET UPDATES

Per SDCL 7-21-8, the Board of Commissioners will meet on Tuesday, September 7, 2010, for the purpose of considering the 2011 budget.

ITEMS FROM CHAIR

A. WESTERN STATE VETERAN'S HOME – CONGRESSIONAL LETTERS OF SUPPORT: MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Glasgow to authorize all Pennington County

Commissioners' signatures on the proposed letter to General Steven R. Doohen in support of locating a new Western State Veteran's Home in Rapid City. Vote: Unanimous.

MISCELLANEOUS

A. APPROVE VOUCHERS: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holbrook to approve the vouchers listed at the end of the minutes for expenditures for insurance, professional services, publications, rentals, supplies, repairs, maintenance, travel, conference fees, utilities, furniture and equipment, and authorize the chair's signature thereto. Vote: Unanimous.

The board recessed from 10:25 to 10:35 a.m.

ITEMS FROM PLANNING AND ZONING

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Glassgow to convene as the Board of Adjustment. Vote: Unanimous.

A. VARIANCE / VA 10-16: Jeff Barber/Brenda Shippen. To reduce the minimum required rear yard setback (south property line) from 25 feet to 12 feet in a Limited Agriculture/ General Agriculture District in accordance with Sections 206 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

That Part of the SE1/4NW1/4NE1/4, SW1/4NE1/4, and SE1/4NE1/4 lying east of the RR ROW; S1/2NE1/4NE1/4; NE1/4NE1/4NE1/4; E1/2E1/2 NW1/4NE1/4NE1/4, all located in Section 34, T1N, R8E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

Moved by Holbrook and seconded by Glassgow to approve Setback Variance 10-16 with (4) conditions recommended by Planning staff. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That a Building Permit be obtained for the subject barn, in which administrative fees will be assessed; 2. That prior to issuance of a Building Permit for the subject barn, an approved Floodplain Development permit be obtained demonstrating the barn's compliance with Pennington County's Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance; 3. That prior to issuance of a Building Permit for the subject barn, an approved On-Site Wastewater Construction Permit be obtained if the barn contains plumbing and is tied into an on-site wastewater treatment system; and, 4. That approval of this Variance request only applies for the portion of the rear-yard (south property line) setback that is encroached upon by the existing barn. All other structures must maintain proper setbacks or obtain separate Variance(s) for that structure.

B. VARIANCE / VA 10-17: Adrian and Cheryl Goodhue. To reduce the minimum required lot size from 10 acres to 1.75 acres and 1.48 acres in a Limited Agriculture District in accordance with Sections 206 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

EXISTING LEGAL: Lots 8 and 9, Block 4, Pactola Estates, Section 17, T1N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lots 8R and 9R, Block 4, Pactola Estates, Section 17, T1N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to approve Variance 10-17 to allow a 1.75 acre and 1.48 acre lot in a Limited Agriculture District with the following two (2) conditions recommended by Planning staff. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That future structures and utilities, including the on-site wastewater system, maintain proper setbacks to the proposed lot lines or else approved Variances be obtained; and, 2. That a Building Permit be obtained for any new structures exceeding 144 square feet and located on a permanent foundation, which will require a site plan to be reviewed and approved by the Pennington County Planning Department.

MOVED by Young and seconded by Trautman to adjourn as a Board of Adjustment and reconvene as the Board of Commissioners. Vote: Unanimous.

C. MINOR PLAT / PL 10-30 AND SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS VARIANCE / SV 10-08: Adrian and Cheryl Goodhue. To reconfigure the lot lines to create Lots 8R and 9R, Block 4, Pactola Estates and to waive platting requirements in accordance with Section 400.3 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: Lots 8 and 9, Block 4, Pactola Estates, Section 17, T1N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lots 8R and 9R, Block 4, Pactola Estates, Section 17, T1N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Young to sustain Planning staff's recommendation to approve Subdivision Regulations Variance 10-08 to waive the submittal of engineered road construction plans and road improvements and approve Minor Plat 10-30 with the following two (2) conditions. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That all structures and the existing on-site wastewater disposal system meet all the required setbacks from the proposed future lot lines; and, 2. That prior to County Board approval of the Minor Plat, the two lots either be rezoned to Suburban Residential District or Lot Size Variances be obtained to allow the 1.752 acre and 1.481 acre lots.

D. LAYOUT PLAT / PL 10-29: Robert Hammerquist/Randall Hammerquist. To create Lot D of Government Lot 3 in accordance with Section 400.1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: Lot 2 of Lot C of GL 2; Balance GL 3 (NE1/4 NW1/4), Section 6, T1N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lot D of Government Lot 3 Section 6, T1N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Young and seconded by Trautman to continue Layout Plat 10-29 to the September 7, 2010, Board of Commissioners' meeting pursuant to Planning Commission recommendation. Vote: Unanimous.

E. MINOR PLAT / PL 10-26 AND SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS VARIANCE / SV 10-07: Cheryl and Todd Bachman; Sanders Family Trust. To reconfigure lot lines to create Tract Adonis and Tract Sunshine and to waive the requirement for submittal of percolation tests and soil profile information in accordance with Sections 400.3 and 700.1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: Adonis No. 3 Lode M.S. 1068 in Section 23 and Sunshine No. 8 Lode M.S. 1068 in Section 26, all located in T1N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Tract Adonis located in Section 23 and Tract Sunshine in Section 26, all located in T1N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to concur with Planning Commission recommendation of denial of Subdivision Regulations Variance to waive the requirement to submit soil profile and percolation tests for proposed Tract Sunshine and approval of Minor Plat 10-26 with the following seven (7) conditions. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That the applicants post the road sign for Sanders Ranch Road prior to the recording of the Minor Plat;
2. That prior to County Board approval of the Minor Plat, the applicant provides soil profile and percolation tests information for proposed Tract Sunshine;
3. That prior to submittal of the mylar, the access easement which traverses through Gov't 2 and Gov't 4 be labeled as a 66-foot-wide access easement;
4. That Black Hills Electric Cooperative's rights to operate and maintain the overhead line are not diminished or adversely affected in any way by the proposed subdivision;
5. That the only types of systems to be allowed on this lot will either need to be a mound system, which meets the 4-foot soil separation from the restrictive layer, or an evapotranspiration system. An evapotranspiration system will require site grading due to the slopes existing on this lot;
6. That due to the bedrock and the possibility of negative environmental impacts, an advanced pretreatment-type septic tank is required with a signed Service Agreement for Tract Sunshine Lode No. 8 M.S. 1608; and,
7. That any alternative type of On-Site Wastewater Treatment Systems must be designed and certified by a Registered Professional Engineer or Licensed Plumber. Any alternative system also needs to be approved by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

F. FIRST READING AND PUBLIC HEARING OF REZONE / RZ 10-01: Yasmeen Dream. To rezone 27.58 acres from General Agriculture District to General Commercial District in accordance with Section 508 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT / CA 10-01: Yasmeen Dream. To amend the Comprehensive Plan to change the Future Land Use from Low Density Residential District to

General Commercial District in accordance with Section 508 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

METES AND BOUNDS LEGAL DESCRIPTION (Rezone): Commencing at the E1/4 corner of Section 19, T1N, R9E, BHM, common to the W1/4 corner of Section 20 T1N, R9E, BHM and the point of beginning; Thence, first course: S00°00'00"E, along the section line common to said Section 19 and said Section 20, a distance of 1320.00 feet to the section 1/16th line; Thence, second course: N90°00'00"W, along the section 1/16th line, a distance of 660.00 feet; Thence third course: N00°00'00"E, a distance of 1820.00 feet; Thence, fourth course: N90°00'00"E, a distance of 660.00 feet, to a point on the section line common to said Section 19, and said Section 20; Thence, fifth course: S00°00'00"E, along the section line common to said Section 19 and said Section 20, a distance of 500.00 feet to the said E1/4 corner of Section 19, common to the said W1/4 corner of Section 20, and the point of beginning. Said Parcel contains 1,201,200 square feet or 27.58 acres more or less.

METES AND BOUNDS LEGAL DESCRIPTION (Comprehensive Plan Amendment): Commencing at; the E1/4 corner of Section 19, T1N, R9E, BHM, common to the W1/4 corner of Section 20 T1N, R9E, BHM and the point of beginning; Thence, first course: N90°00'00"W, along the section 1/4 line of said Section 19, a distance of 660.00 feet; Thence, second course: N00°00'00"E, a distance of 500.00 feet; Thence, third course: N90°00'00"E, a distance of 660.00 feet, to a point on the section line common to said Section 19, and said Section 20; Thence, fourth course: S00°00'00"E, along the section line common to said Section 19 and said Section 20, a distance of 500.00 feet to the said E1/4 corner of Section 19, common to the said W1/4 corner of Section 20, and the point of beginning. Said Parcel contains 330,000 square feet or 7.58 acres more or less.

MOVED by Glasgow and seconded by Holbrook to concur with the Planning Commission's recommended approval of Rezone 10-01 to rezone 27.58 acres from General Agriculture District to General Commercial District and to approve the Comprehensive Plan Amendment 10-01 for a portion of the rezone request from Low Density Residential District to General Commercial. Vote: Unanimous.

G. LAYOUT PLAT / PL 10-27: Linda and Larry Pearson. To create Lots 3, 4, and 5 of Hill City Heights in accordance with Section 400.1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: All less Hill City Heights (also in Section 31), White Whale Lode, MS 664 in Section 30 and GL 17 less Hill City Heights, all located in T1S, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lots 3, 4, and 5, Hill City Heights, Sections 30 and 31, T1S, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Young to approve Layout Plat 10-27 with the following nine (9) conditions pursuant to Planning Commission recommendation. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That prior to County Board approval of the Preliminary Plat, the applicant provides a second means of ingress and egress or obtains approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement; 2. That prior to applying for a Preliminary Plat, the applicant must provide adequate percolation test results, which includes eight (8) foot soil profile information for each lot or obtains approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement; 3. That the Section Line Highway be improved to Ordinance 14 Standards, which includes 24 foot-wide driving surface with a minimum of four inches of gravel or obtain approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement; 4. That at the time of Preliminary Plat submittal, the applicant submits engineered road construction plans for the Section Line Highway or obtains approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement; 5. That prior to County Board approval of the Preliminary Plat, the applicant submits topography at five (5) foot contour intervals or obtains approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement; 6. That at the time of submittal of the Preliminary Plat, the applicant submits engineered construction plans for Forest Street or obtains a Subdivision Regulations Variance waiving this requirement; 7. That the roads are built to Local Road Standards, which includes a 24 foot driving surface with a minimum of 4 inches of gravel or approval of a Subdivision Regulations Variance be obtained waiving this requirement; 8. That an intermediate turn-around be constructed within the development or a Subdivision Regulations Variance is obtained waiving this requirement; and, 9. That the Final Plat removes the old property lines within the existing Lots 1 and 2 of Hill City Heights Subdivision.

H. LAYOUT PLAT / PL 10-28: Valiant Vineyards/Eldon Nygaard. To create Lot G of Murray Subdivision in accordance with Section 400.1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: Lot F of Murray Subdivision and the unplatted PT in NW1/4SW1/4 lying NW of Country Road and SE of Lot H3 in Section 21, T1S, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lot G of Murray Subdivision, Section 21, T1S, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Holbrook and seconded by Young to continue Layout Plat 10-28 to the September 7, 2010, Board of Commissioners' meeting per Planning Commission recommendation. Vote: Unanimous.

I. AUTHORIZATION – 319 SPRING CREEK GRANT PAYMENT REQUISITIONS.

MOVED by Glasgow and seconded by Young to authorize Dan Jennissen, Planning Director, and/or Brittney Molitor, Water Protection Coordinator, to submit and sign payment requisitions for reimbursement by the South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources to Pennington County for payments made on behalf of the Spring Creek Watershed Management and Project Implementation Plan – Segment 1. Vote: Unanimous.
